Embrace Inclusion Program

Our Embrace program is an inclusion hub. Whether it is with support, cultural learning, curriculum participation, or longterm assistance, we work closely with families in every room, every day.

One example: When we have a child who needs additional support, unlike many other centres, we don't have waiting times to begin support programs (some other Centres face long wait times). Simply put – we get things started and support the child and parents within the Centre, and if they need, provide information and support if the family is referred to an external health or development specialist. The program links into the children's curriculums and so is integrated across the Centre.

SPOTLIGHT ON ROOMS Unicare Cooking Program



After a revamp of the Centre's nutrition and menu program in 2022, and as our wonderful **Chef Josh** has settled into his new role, we are now ready to begin our children's cooking program. The program will provide children with unique cooking experiences. Through fun and educational sessions, this program enables children to develop an understanding of healthy nutrition, culture, and family, shared communal responsibilities, proper hygiene, and safety procedures in the kitchen.

Cooking will provide our children with a fun, holistic learning experience where they engage in hands-on activities developing life skills. A single cooking experience integrates different learning outcomes from the Early Years Learning Framework such as numeracy, science and discovery, problem solving, prediction, language development, social skills, fine motor coordination, emerging independence, and sense of agency.

THE POWER OF A NAME

The cooking program is a huge favourite at Unicare – it was once called 'Little Chefs'; however as one of the children pointed out 'We aren't little'. In 2023, to give the children ownership over the program, we asked some children what they wanted to call their program. The children suggested 'Let's eat', 'Cooking' and from one - 'My dad is the best cook ever', so we will get back to you when they have had their input! SPOTLIGHT ON ROOMS Communication and Languages Programs

THIS MONTH: AUSLAN - SIGN LANGUAGE

Through a play-based focus, children engage in small sessions with new words and phrases being introduced and consolidated over the year. This program provides the perfect foundation to introduce and engage our children in various languages. We are deeply engaged with learning Auslan Sign Language each week during term time. **The Signing Hands** program is up each week across the rooms and on the parent noticeboard in the garden courtyard.

YOUR CHILD'S PROGRAM – HOW WE DO IT! Observing and planning for your child

At the beginning of the year, our focus is on getting to know the children and their growing needs.

- 1. We start the year with a series of observations on the children. These form what we call direct observations, or they may be a learning story or narrative about what we see when your child is at play.
- 2. We then begin or continue with your child's 'child development milestones assessment'. When these are underway, we will invite you to meet with the Senior Educator and we will go through it with you.

We use all of this information to develop your child's plan.


February Parent Survey
